Tesco community grant – Bags of Help

Bags of Help

Voluntary and community organisations including charities, parish councils, local authorities, social housing associations, schools and health bodies can apply for three awards of up to £1,000, £2,000 and £4,000.

Three community projects from each region are selected; customers in Tesco stores in your area can vote for their favourite project in November/December 2019 and following the voting period the grants are allocated 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize.

The project can be for the benefit local community groups, improvements to buildings that benefit local community, to develop outdoor areas or run community events or activities, or support seasonal activities. Check online for [eligibility details](#).

The Tudor Trust



Constituted community groups, voluntary groups, registered charities, unincorporated associations, community interest companies and industrial and provident societies which are supporting people at the margins of society can apply for up to £10,000.

Your project should support positive changes in people's lives and in their communities. Groups can apply for core and capital funding and grants to purchase equipment and help strengthen your organisation.

The Screwfix Foundation

UK-registered charities and not-for-profit organisations can apply for up to £5,000 to Fix, Maintain, Improve and Repair charitable and community facilities within the UK. Applications are reviewed on a quarterly basis in January, April, July and October.

The Henry Smith Charity Strengthening Communities Fund

The [Strengthening Communities grant programme](#) is designed to support small UK-based, community-led charities and not-for-profit organisations working at grassroots level to make a difference to the most disadvantaged areas of the UK.

The Henry Smith Charity wishes to fund work that enables people from across the community to participate in activities that improve connectivity, opportunities and wellbeing. The funds should help people who are excluded, vulnerable or facing other forms of hardship to have access to community-based services that support positive lasting change and build a stronger, active, more engaged community.

You can apply for between £20,000 and £60,000 per year, up to three years.
